
CT Trails Day Hike

Spotlight on Bridgewater Barns

Shallow Brook Farm on Christian Street has been operating since 1926. The original owner Henry Stuart made a living by buying and selling horses suited for Western riding. He also fed his family of 12 children with chickens, eggs and milk from a small herd of dairy cows. The farm is now operated by Henry's son, William Stuart, and is focused on English style riding. Additional barns have been added and old barns restored to include box stalls, two tack rooms, an indoor riding arena and a wash room.
