
Welcome Lisa Lisa Antel joins BWLT Board of Directors


View The Blue Moon

Town Line Road at the BWLT parking area is the perfect spot to view the rising moon. The area will be open late on Wednesday, August 30th from 8 PM to 10 PM for those who would like to observe the blue moon. A blue moon is an additional full moon that appears in a subdivision of a year. Owing to the rarity of a blue moon, the term "blue moon" is used colloquially to mean a rare event, as in the phrase "once in a blue moon." Bring a chair and whatever else you need to enjoy the view. Spotlight on Bridgewater Barns

In the distance is Schaghticoke Farm on Northrup Street. For many years beginning in the early 1920's, this 165 acre farm was a dairy operation run by George Pratt who specialized in the production of "Golden Guernsey" known as a superlative, high-fat milk. In 1973, Mr. Pratt donated this land and other farm holdings to the Nature Conservancy to be permanently preserved in agriculture. Today Stuart Family Farm leases this land and buildings. They raise all-natural beef, pork and chickens.
