The New Year Brings New Opportunities *Planning For A Productive Year Ahead*

The Bridgewater Land Trust anticipates a productive and exciting year ahead. Your enthusiastic support in 2023 has helped us advance our mission at a pace we didn't think possible. Thank you!

Some initial plans for 2024 include:

Trail Improvements and Expansions

Passive recreation and opportunities to explore our Preserves will be a priority again in 2024. We are investing in stewardship support to expand and improve our public trails. We are also pleased to be partnering with The Nature Conservancy and the Roxbury Land Trust. Specifically, we will be working with The Nature Conservancy to enhance, and in some cases, expand trails in and around our Tappen Brook Trails network. The Nature Conservancy will hire additional staff for a 12 week period beginning in May to assist with trail projects. Work will include: clearing trails, installing water bars, and additional upgrades to address erosion. Our Town Line Farm Trail in Roxbury will benefit from a new connecting trail thanks to the Roxbury Land Trust. Beginning late spring or early summer of 2024, the RLT will be building trails on newly acquired land by Minor Bridge Road that borders the east side of our Town Line Farm Preserve near Camp Brook.
