30 x 30 Initiative Doing Our Part To Save The Planet


30 x 30 is a global conservation goal to conserve, connect, and restore 30 percent of our lands and waters by 2030. It has been adopted by 90 countries worldwide including the United States. Many area land trusts in Connecticut have adopted this goal and the Bridgewater Land Trust is now among them.

Among the specific reasons cited for urgent action:

- Our wetlands and river ecosystems have been reduced by 50% in the lower 48 states.
- In the past two decades, we have lost 17,000 square miles of farm and ranchland.
- There are 3 billion fewer **birds** in North America than there were 50 years ago.
- There has been an alarming decline of **bees and other pollinators** which are critical to our food supply.

In the state of CT, 18% of the land is permanently protected, Bridgewater is above average with 23%. We are actively pursuing opportunities to preserve ecologically important land in hopes that we can do our part to achieve the 30% goal within the next 6 years.

Please contact us if you have land or know of land that we can help protect. Keep in mind that land can be donated or sold to a conservation organization. Land can also be preserved through a conservation easement which allows landowners to retain ownership but restrict future development.

Join Us For This Free Event


