# **Investing In Our Farms**

Your Support Is Critical

The community has an opportunity this year to support the modernization and repurposing of our dairy barn at the Town Line Farm Preserve. The barn is part of a historic farmstead that is admired by many for its classic and rural appeal. The 119-acre farm and property was donated to the Bridgewater Land Trust in 1991 by Terry & Libby Fitzgerald, Peter & Leni May and Bill Rondina. We will forever be grateful for their generosity.

The proposed work on the south end of the dairy barn will not only enhance the aging building visually, but will provide a more practical space to support modern farming needs and youth agricultural education. Shepaug AgriScience students will have access to this barn for on-site skill development, projects, and shared learning by experienced farmers.

The cost of this renovation will be approximately \$185,000. We have applied for a grant through the CT Department of Agriculture which could cover up to \$49,000. Support from our community will be critical to the success of this project. Our upcoming Give Local campaign is the ideal time to help.

### The Town Line Farm Dairy Barn

Current State Of The Building

The photographs below show the current state of the south end of the dairy barn. The large hay bales will be removed and future bales will be stored in the new on-site hay storage

dome. The uneven floor originally used as the "drop" to facilitate the removal of manure, will be demolished and replaced with a flat and usable concrete floor. The deteriorating inside walls will be repaired and the exterior siding, windows, and doors will be replaced. The livestock viewing platform (bottom photo) is in complete disrepair and will be demolished and replaced. The barn will also be repainted in the original barn red color.

### **Game Camera Installed**




