Our hopes are high and our dreams are big as we push forward with initiatives that support our natural and working lands.

A Give-A-Thon With a Competitive Twist

The annual **Give Local** campaign has become our biggest fundraiser of the year. We will cheer on all the wonderful non-profits, but we also will feel our competitive juices flowing.

There will be a sense of pride to see a Bridgewater charity on the leader board especially when we will be competing with much larger communities and organizations.

Over 310 non-profit organizations participated in the CT Community Foundations Give Local event in 2024, and likely, there will be as many or more in 2025. This on-line, 36 hour give-athon, is filled with excitement! There are cash prizes to win, bonus funds, match opportunities and a leader board that shows in real time who is out front! In 2024 we came in 2nd place overall and 1st place among "small" organizations. Let's try to get there again!

There is no doubt that this is the best time to support land preservation in Bridgewater. We are very grateful to the 225 people who contributed in 2024. We rely completely on your generosity to do our important work.

A special thanks to Bridgewater resident and BWLT Director, Chris Amorossi for the \$35,000 matching challenge (wow!) and to the Will Stuart Team for their \$5,000 donor challenge (if we reach 200 donors, we unlock an additional \$5,000). We are off to an impressive start!

It's Nature's Busy Season And You Can Help

Our forests and fields are abuzz with activity as wildlife wakes up for springtime. It is always a thrill to see the beautiful creatures who live among us. There are many things that humans can do to aid in their survival. Here are a few reminders:

- For the pollinators, please resist the urge to clean up your gardens until temperatures are consistently above 50 degrees. Many butterflies, bees and other pollinators are overwintering in the dead leaves and may not survive disruption.
- Do not use poisons to kill yard pests like moles. These poisons can and do kill owls, other raptors, and predatory animals. The most humane way to get rid of moles is to use beneficial nematodes that dine on the grubs that form much of the mole diet.
- While we love to see bears in our yards, do not attract them with easy to open garbage receptacles left out overnight. Bear-resistant garbage cans are a good option. A few choices with high ratings: Toter's Bear Tough Trash or Rehrig Pacific Bear Resistant Roll-Out Carts (used by All American Waste). Also remember to close your grills and only fill your bird feeders in the winter.
- Drive like a turtle! Early morning hours and dusk are the most active times for wildlife. They will be on the move this time of year seeking food for hungry babies.
- Speaking of turtles, if you help them across the road, be sure to place them in the direction they were heading.






Impact Report


